Preamble

The School of Humanities and Social Sciences is made up of the Dean's office, Departments and an Institute within the School. The Dean's office is responsible for the day to day operations of the School in liaison with the Departments and Institutes. It is also the link between the central University Administration, Departments, and Institute.

Objectives

- To implement a socially relevant research agenda for staff and students based on global demands and challenges.
- To design and develop programmes that enhance acquisition and cultivation of ethical values in staff and students as effective leaders in their various fields.

Structure

The School of Humanities and Social Sciences is made up of eight departments and one institute namely:

1. Department of Literature, Linguistics and Foreign Languages

The department offers a wide range of courses in various areas in English Language and Linguistics and enhances knowledge in critical appreciation and appraisal of the various literary genres. It also offers courses in four languages namely; French, German and Japanese and Portuguese.

2. Department of Sociology, Gender & Development Studies

The department offers a variety of programmes in various areas of specialization such as Demography, Community Development, Social Planning and Evaluation. The programmes are also designed to address such issues as: Gender disparities in all sectors of the economy, mainstreaming gender in policy formulation and socio-economic development.

3. **Department of Geography**

The department offers a diversity of courses such as Climatology, Hydrology and Water Resources, Integrated watershed Management, Population Geography, Settlement, Medical Geography, Development Geography, Tourism, Biogeography, Agricultural Geography, Economic and Industrial Geography, Geomorphology, Geography of Marketing, Transport Geography, Urban and Regional Planning, Cartography, Remote Sensing and ASAL's among others.

4. Department of History, Archaeology and Political Studies

The department offers a variety of courses in History, Archaeology and Political Studies. The courses aim at developing historical and socio-cultural consciousness that are critical for development, as well as train and nurture critical, responsible, resourceful and patriotic human power in various sectors of national development.

5. Department of Kiswahili and African Studies

The department offers a variety of courses in Kiswahili Language and Literature and in other African Languages, it is also tasked with conducting research and offering teaching programmes on the peoples and cultural heritage of Africa. In addition it carries out state of the art consultancy services on African issues.

6. Department of Philosophy and Religious Studies

The department offers courses in two mutually exclusive areas of Philosophy and Religious Studies.

6.1 **Philosophy**

Philosophy offers a rich variety of courses which aim at developing intellectual standards that enable students to think for themselves, make judgments and decisions responsibly and intelligently. Philosophy also emphasizes courses in Ethics which sensitize students to moral awareness and sensibilities that impact on them as individuals and collectively as members of society.

6.2 Religious Studies

There are three main areas of study in Religious Studies, namely; African Traditional Religion, Christianity and Islamic Studies which offer courses from undergraduate to doctoral levels.

7. **Department of Psychology**

The department offers degree courses designed to meet the fast growing demand for expertise in pure and applied psychology. It offers courses in areas such as Clinical, Industrial, Health and Social Counseling and Personality Profiles to meet the rising need for professionals in the field of Psychology.

8. **Department of Public Policy and Administration**

The department of Public Policy & Administration offers a number of flagship programmes available in regular, part-time mode and digital mode.

1. Confucius Institute

Masters Degree Programmes

All the departments in the School of Humanities and Social Sciences offer Masters programmes which are offered through coursework, then project or thesis. The duration of study is two (2) years full time and four (4) years part-time.

Applicants must possess a Bachelor's Degree in related studies or equivalent qualification from Kenyatta University or any other recognized institution of higher learning and meet departmental requirements.

Doctoral Programmes

All the departments in the School offer PhD programmes which are offered through thesis. The duration of the study is three (3) years full time and six (6) years part-time.

Applicants must possess a Masters Degree in related studies or equivalent qualification from Kenyatta University or any other recognized institution of higher learning and meet departmental requirements.

Admission requirements

Bachelor of Arts (General)

In addition to meeting the University entry requirements, the students are required to have attained a minimum of C+ grade in any 3 of the following subjects: English, Kiswahili, Mathematics, History & Government, Geography and Religious Studies.

The student must also have attained a (24.382) KUCCPS cluster points.

The subject combinations include:

Bachelor of Arts (Psychology)

In addition to meeting the University entry requirements, the students are required to have attained a minimum of C+ grade in any 3 of the following subjects: English, Kiswahili, Mathematics, History & Government, Geography and Religious Studies.

The student must also have attained a mean grade of (31.653) KUCCPS cluster points.

The subject combinations include Psychology, Philosophy & Religious Studies, English, Sociology and Common Units.

Bachelor of Arts (Counseling Psychology)

In addition to meeting the University entry requirements, the students are required to have attained a minimum of C+ grade in any 3 of the following subjects: English, Kiswahili, Mathematics, History & Government, Geography and Religious Studies.

The student must also have attained a (29.331) KUCCPS cluster points.

The subject combinations for the programme include Psychology, Philosophy & Religious Studies, English, Sociology and Common Units.

Bachelor of Arts (Gender & Development Studies)

In addition to meeting the university requirements, the students are required to have attained a minimum of C+ grade in any 3 of the following subjects: English, Kiswahili, Mathematics, History & Government, Geography and Religious Studies.

The student must also have attained a (25.803) KUCCPS cluster points.

The subject combinations for this programme include:

- 1. Gender, Psychology, Sociology, Common Units
- 2. Gender, Philosophy and Religious Studies, Sociology, Common Units
- 3. Gender, History, Psychology, Common Units
