The 24th graduation ceremony took place on Friday, 25th July, 2008 at the University Graduation square. The ceremony, which was full of pomp and colour, was presided over by the Chancellor, Dr. Harris Mule. Some two thousand and eleven (2011) graduands were conferred with various degrees, diplomas and certificates of Kenyatta University.

In his speech to mark the occasion, Dr. Harris Mule wished all the graduands the best in their future careers and professional life. “I wish you all the best in your future career, and welcome you as the newest members of Kenyatta University Alumni. Today you celebrate your significant achievements in life - the completion of your course of study, and for many of you, the beginning of the next phase of your life as a professional in your chosen field. We are proud of you!” said Dr. Mule. Graduation, Dr. Mule said, provides us with an opportunity to recognise our students’ great achievements publicly and is therefore, deservedly, a time of great pride for the University, the graduands, their families, friends and the entire staff of the University.

The Chancellor assured the graduands that Kenyatta University had given them the best in education. “Keep your heads high because you have received a

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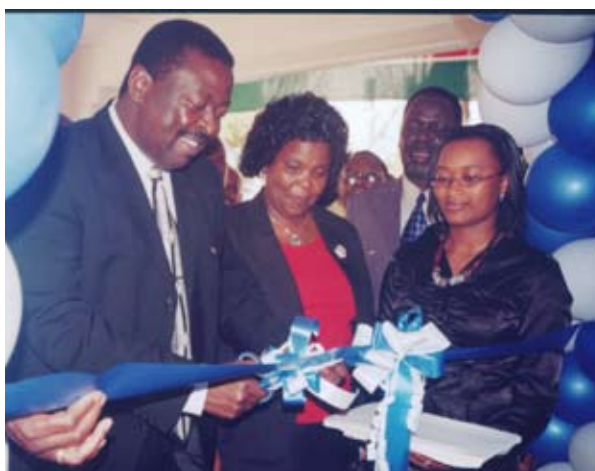

“I Take Pride In Your Excellence” - Deputy PM

The Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Local Government Hon. Musalia Mudavadi officially inaugurated the ultra-modern Mombasa Campus at a colourful ceremony held on Friday, 11th July, 2008 at the Campus. The Campus is located in the Central Business District of the coastal city of Mombasa. In his address, the Deputy Prime Minister applauded the University Management for its noble initiative to establish a University Campus away from Nairobi, a decision which is in line with the Government’s objective of further decentralization of higher learning educational institutions to bring them closer to the people.

On the recent achievements by the University, Hon. Mudavadi congratulated the Council, the Vice-Chancellor and her management team for the major milestones the University has achieved in the last three years. He singled out the University’s excellent rating in Performance Contracting in the 2006/07 Performance Cycle and the ISO 9001:2000 Certification, stating, “Being number one among State Corporations is no mean achievement. . As a Deputy Prime Minister, I take pride in your

excellence in academic and quality management systems,” Hon Mudavadi stated. Addressing the gathering, the Minister for Higher Education, Science & Technology, commended the visionary leadership of the University Council and management for making systematic and speedy interventions in addressing some of the challenges

facing higher education e.g. access. The Minister, who was represented by the Director for Higher Education, Mr. David Siele, stated that by opening several campuses to offer university education in Coast Province, Kenyatta University and the Government, were responding to the recommendations of the Public Universities Inspection Report (2006). “The programmes we establish should be responsive to the market demands, national needs and priorities. Focus the skills acquired to the demands by industry,” urged Dr. Kosgei.

"The secret path to the top is discipline, sacrifice, hard work and focus" this was the Vice-Chancellor's message to the students of Gitugi Girls High School when she recently addressed them as the Guest of Honour during the School's prize giving day.

Congratulating the girls for remaining focused while all round them other schools were rioting, Prof. Olive Mugenda encouraged the students to be steadfast and true to themselves so that when all is said and done, "you will be counted among the schools that chose to do the right thing. Take stock of your achievements, have a vision and focus on the prize, and no matter the hurdles you encounter, you can make it." Prof. Mugenda encouraged.

The Vice-Chancellor advised the teachers to be committed and endeavour to share their knowledge and time selflessly and willingly for the sake of their students. Citing empirical evidence, Prof. Mugenda stated that "a teacher's attitude towards her/his job and the students, to a greater extent determines the quality of performance of the students. "A good teacher is like a candle. It spares nothing, even itself, as it lights up the surrounding for others" she concluded.

Prof. Mugenda had a seven-point advise to parents. She informed them that their role influences the level of pupils academic motivation greatly. Some of these are:-

- Concern about child's performance
- Positive attitude towards your child no matter what
- Encourage them continuously
- Be alert/ aware of level of performance
- Recognize/reward good performance/ success.

The Vice-Chancellor promised to engage the government in discussions to explore the possibilities of increased funding to University with a view to expanding infrastructure facilities to ensure that students join public Universities immediately they leave 4th form without having to wait for over 2 years to do so.

The ceremony was attended by opinion leaders in Murang'a North, including the area member of Parliament, Hon. Captain Clement M. Wambugu, who urged the students not to be 4K students i.e. those who "kuamka, kurandaranda, kulalamika na kulala". He urged the teachers to be "mwalimu bora" not "bora mwalimu". The District Education Officer, concillors, church leaders and principals of neighbouring schools were also present.

Kenyatta University has been selected as a potential site for piloting of a youth video game by Warner Brothers (WB) in

Kenya. The project is being undertaken in collaboration with the United States Agency for International Development's (USAID's), partnership for An HIV Free Generation initiative which reaches youth in-and-out of school.

The video game's target age groups are 15-19 year old youth, the majority of "videogame players," who often have not received sufficient attention from existing HIV programs. The

initiative with WB/USAID aims to encourage Kenyan youth to delay sexual debut/secondary abstinence, reduce number of sexual partners, increase condom use, increase HIV testing including partner testing/notification, address

alcohol and drug abuse, increase use of services/health seeking behaviour and promote open communication about HIV.

Pathfinder International when approached by WB in early 2008 to propose possible sites for this youth program, suggested KU because of the longstanding peer education program i.e the Kenyatta University Family Welfare and Counseling Centre (KUFW&CC). This was further justified by the fact that KU's ICT Unit and infrastructure has the capacity to pilot the project
